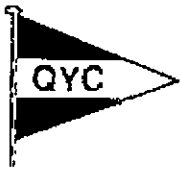
MEMBERS FAVORITE RECIPES

Layered Seafood Spread
(makes about 30 appetizer servings)

1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened
1 tablespoon finely chopped onion
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1 teaspoon worcestershire sauce
¾ pound chilled crabmeat or shrimp, finely chopped
1-½ cups (12 ounce jar) seafood cocktail sauce
¼ cup chopped fresh parsley
crackers or fresh vegetables

Combine cream cheese, onion, lemon juice and worcestershire sauce in medium bowl; mix well. Spread over bottom of small serving dish; top with crabmeat or shrimp.

Pour cocktail sauce over the crabmeat (or shrimp); sprinkle with parsley. Chill for 2 hours. Serve with crackers or vegetables.
